



Baroness Tanni Grey-Thompson DBE

Baroness Tanni Grey-Thompson competed at five Paralympic Games starting in Seoul in 1988, through to Athens in 2004. She also competed at four Olympic Demonstration races from Barcelona in 1992 up to Athens.

During her career she won a total of 16 Paralympic medals which included 11 gold, 4 silver and 1 bronze.

She also won 14 World Championship medals; 6 gold, 5 silver, 3 bronze, and 6 London Wheelchair Marathons

Board Work

Tanni Grey-Thompson is a Board Member of Transport for London, and Chair of its Remuneration Committee, and its Surface Transport Panel.

She is President of the National Council for Voluntary Organisations and Chair of their Leadership 20:20 Commission.

She is also a Board Member of the London Marathon and sits on the Board of the London Legacy Development Corporation.

She has worked with UK Sport as a Board Member and Vice Chair of the Lottery Panel which managed Performance Funding to elite sport.

From 2007-12 she was a Board Member of UK Athletics in which capacity she carried out a full review of the anti-doping policies and procedures for UKA.

She was an integral part of LOCOG, and was Vice Chair of the Athletes Committee and a Member of the Diversity Board.

House of Lords

In 2010 Tanni was elevated to the House of Lords as a Crossbench Peer, and works in areas of Sport, Welfare Reform and Legal Aid.
